


Memorial Day Parade

He was quickly chosen for Sea School and sent to Norfolk, Virginia, where he was trained and eventually assigned to the USS Langley CVL27.

James and the Langley joined the Fast Carrier Task Force 58-3, which was the main striking force of the United States Navy in the Pacific War Zone, he spent 18 months fighting our enemies. For his service in World War II, James was awarded 13 battle stars.

Upon returning home, he took classes in banking

and joined National City Bank. In 1952 he married Stella and they were blessed with five children and nine grandchildren.

James has been active in Toys for Tots and many civic affairs. In 2004, he was named "Man of the Year" by the Village of Lynbrook and has received an "Award of Appreciation" for his service in the United States Marine Corps from the Lynbrook/East Rockaway Rotary Club.
