TERWILLINGER & BARTONE DEPOST RES.#311-19

It was moved by Trustee Reardon, seconded by Trustee Boccio, to require Terwillinger and Bartone, applicant for a Special Use Permit as heard at a Public Hearing on October 21, 2019, to deposit an initial fee in the amount of \$20,000 to pay Village legal and engineering review costs, if such application is approved. Motion carried, all voting "Aye."

WALK THROUGH PROJECT DESIGN RES.#<u>312-19</u>

It was moved by Trustee Boccio, seconded by Trustee Reardon, to engage H2M for engineering services to design an access walkthrough from the west side of Atlantic Avenue to Broadway on the first floor of the southerly side of 25 Atlantic Avenue, and authorize the negotiation of purchase of said property. LYNBROOK LITTLE LEAGUE REGISTRATION SIGNS RES.#322-19 It was moved by Trustee Boccio, seconded by Trustee Reardon, to grant permission to Lynbrook Little League to post temporary Registration banners at Greis Park on Horton Avenue fence. Motion carried, all voting "Aye."

P.H.-ABANDONMENT OF PART OF ROXY PLACE RES.#<mark>323-19</mark>

Mayor Beach opened a Public Hearing pursuant to Section 6-612 of Village Law to consider the discontinuance of a portion of a street known as Roxy Place. William Bonesso, Esq. representing Terwillinger & Bartone advised that his clients are awaiting a Board decision on its October 21, 2019 application for a Special Use Permit Public Hearing for the construction of an 80-unit multiple dwelling at 5 Freer Street, such project utilizing part of the roadbed of Roxy Place that abuts 5 Freer Street, as contemplated by the Village's 2016 Request for Proposals, and requested the Board to abandon such section of Roxy Place pursuant to Section 6-612 of Village Law. After a brief discussion, Mr. Bonesso introduced Wayne Miller of Robinson & Muller Traffic Engineers, who presented eastbound and westbound traffic counts of Roxy Place, advised that there are alternative routes to Roxy Place and discontinuing that part of Roxy Place that abuts 5 Freer Street would have no adverse impact on traffic. Mr. Matthew Elwer, Civil Engieer reported that the roadbed would accommodate above grade parking areas for the proposed project and not have an effect on underground utilities on Roxy Place. Mr. Bonesso advised that his clients would agree to purchase such roadbed as per Village appraisal for \$500,000, provided that the Special Use Permit application is approved and submitted a letter of support signed by residents of 12 and 14 Roxy Place. Mayor Beach asked for comments. After no further comments, it was moved by Mayor Beach to close the Hearing and reserve decision, seconded by Trustee Boccio. carried, all voting "Aye."

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BILLS

It was moved by Trustee Boccio, seconded by Trustee Reardon, that Bills listed on Abstract of Audited Voucher #8, General Fund - \$207,497.96; Capital Fund - \$40,027.13, Electronic Transfer - \$428,459.39, Community Development - \$33.000.00, all be paid as soon as same have been duly audited by the majority.
