PROPOSED HOTEL-LANGDON PLACE

Special Village Counsel Jack Libert introduced Len Garten, Monroe Kaufman and Lee Browning, Sr. of Browning Hotel Venture (BHV). Mr. Garten advised at length that it is his objective to obtain a lease from the Village to utilize air rights over the Village's Langdon Place Municpal Parking Lot #3 to construct a new 156 room hotel. Mr. Garten indicated that in exchange for the Lease, BHV would construct 110 additional municipal parking spaces, and pay a \$5.00 per occupied room fee to the Village. Mr. Garten presented a conceptual site plan showing the Hotel lobby on the first floor, and Hotel rooms on the upper 3 floors for a total height of 68'; 96 on-site parking spots would be provided for Hotel guests, and all 134 existing Village commuter public parking spaces would be maintained on site for the public. Several in attendance commented. The Mayor thanked Mr. Garten for his presentation, and advised that Public Hearings would be scheduled in the future to consider this concept.
