- 3. The specific assignment for the Committee will be to locate those utility poles throughout the Village which had previously been marked with white paint for the purpose of "Hydrant Identification." The Committee will determine if said white paint markings had become faded to the extent that said "Hydrant Identification" is not effective, and re-paint said white markings to restore the effective function of "Hydrant Identification".
- 4. The Village of Lynbrook shall provide the required white paint for the aforesaid purposes.
- 5. The Village Administrator is instructed to take the necessary steps to add Citizens Advisory Committee for Fire Hydrant Identification to the Village general liability insurance policy to the extent that the said Committee performs the foregoing Village action, and obtain a Certificate of Insurance from the Boy Scouts of America.
- 6. To the extent directed in paragraph 3 above, the Citizens Committee for Fire Hydrant Identification shall be deemed an agent of the Village of Lynbrook and include in the 1954 Pole Attachment Agreement with the New York Telephone Company and its successor Verizon and a similar agreement with LIPA as successor to such agreement with LILCO.
