## LYNBROOK ANNOUNCES RENOVATION OF LIRR STATION PLATFORM

In joining with other local officials, Mayor Alan Beach announces the completion of renovations on the Lynbrook LIRR Platform. Lynbrook is a village of 19,000 residents with many commuters to New York City and serves as an important transfer station at the junction of the Long Beach & Babylon branches.

Built in 1936, Lynbrook station is a pre-war station composed of a concrete viaduct with two island platforms. Some of the improvements included in this multi-million dollar renovation include an upgraded drainage system, replacement of canopies, two new glass waiting rooms, new signage, LED lighting, and CCTV cameras. Additional work is also planned downstairs on new asphalt and concrete sidewalks, curbs, and improvements to the station house pending funding.

Mayor Beach noted the power of the partnership between the village and the LIRR: "Mr. Eng (President of the LIRR) and Mr. Garcia (Senior Director of External Affairs) have been extremely cooperative in getting this much needed work done during a global pandemic." Mayor Beach added "Lynbrook is one of Long Island's premiere villages and now it will have a premiere train station to compliment the resurgence happening in our downtown corridor."
