1           MAYOR BEACH: Good Evening, welcome to the  
2 Board Meeting of April 5<sup>th</sup>.

3           I will ask everyone to rise for the Pledge  
4 of Allegiance and ask Mr. Peter Ledwith, the real  
5 Peter Ledwith to lead us in the Pledge.

6           (Whereupon, Peter Ledwith led the Assembly  
7 in the Pledge of Allegiance. After, the following  
8 ensued.)

9           MAYOR BEACH: Thank you, everyone. I hope  
10 everyone had a pleasant Easter and Passover.

11           We will get right into the agenda. Well, I  
12 know Deputy Mayor Hawxhurst had a little comment  
13 before we get started.

14           DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Yeah, I would like  
15 to take a moment of silence to remember Roseanne  
16 Strife who passed a few days ago.

17           So, if we could take a moment to pray for  
18 her.

19           (Whereupon, a moment of silence of pray for  
20 Roseanne Strife was observed. After, the  
21 following ensued.)

22           DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Thank you.

23           MAYOR BEACH: Thank you.

24           First on the agenda are the Minutes of  
25 March 22<sup>nd</sup>, does anybody have any comments on the

1 Minutes?

2 (Whereupon, "no" was heard. After, the  
3 following ensued.)

4 MAYOR BEACH: There is just a minor change  
5 that I have; we spoke ab out outdoor dining and it  
6 said that we did approve it.

7 We did approve it but there was some minor  
8 changes, so, I think that should be reflected in  
9 the Minutes.

10 It is not going to be as it was in the  
11 past.

12 There will be some adjustments.

13 John, can we just say that adjustments will  
14 be made to it?

15 VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR GIORDANO: Yes.

16 MAYOR BEACH: Thank you.

17 Second on the agenda is very exciting that  
18 we have a new Member of the Board, someone I  
19 dearly, dearly enjoy and cherish and I will ask  
20 her Dad to swear her in to the Village Board.

21 (Whereupon, applause from the audience was  
22 heard. After, the following ensued.)

23 (Whereupon, Peter Ledwith administered the  
24 oath of office to Laura Ledwith Ryder. Applause  
25 from the audience and photos were taken. After,

1 the following ensued.)

2 MAYOR BEACH: Next, I am very excited about  
3 my Deputy Mayor.

4 I get to swear him in, again and I have to  
5 say that Michael has been such an asset to this  
6 Board and to me and he is such a good friend and  
7 such a good friend to this Village and this is  
8 really very exciting to me that we have people  
9 that are on this Board hat are dedicated to this  
10 Village and all they do is care about this  
11 Village.

12 (Whereupon, Mayor Beach administered the  
13 oath of office to Deputy Mayor Hawxhurst. After,  
14 the following ensued.)

15 (Whereupon, applause and pictures were  
16 taken. After, the following ensued.)

17 MAYOR BEACH: This is a good time for this  
18 Village.

19 It is a difficult time with the COVID but  
20 we are getting through it and we are working hard  
21 and it is great to have a team that does that.

22 Next on the agenda is the appointments and  
23 I will go to my Village Administrator, Mr.  
24 Giordano.

25 VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR GIORDANO: Yes,

1 Mayor, I ask for a Motion for the following  
2 Resolutions, Resolved that the regular meetings of  
3 the Board of Trustees be held on the first and  
4 third Mondays of each month at 7:00 o'clock p.m.  
5 at the Village Hall for the ensuing year and let  
6 it be resolved that the Village Prosecuting  
7 Attorneys are authorized to prosecute all  
8 violations of the Village Code, Zoning Code and  
9 New York State laws and regulations that occur  
10 within the Incorporated Village of Lynbrook.

11 And, let it be resolved the retirement  
12 system reporting purposes, six hours equal the  
13 work day for the following positions: Mayor,  
14 Trustee, Village Justice, Acting Village Justice,  
15 Village Attorney, Deputy Village Attorney, Traffic  
16 Control Assistant, Crossing Guard and Neighborhood  
17 Aide and Resolve that the Board of Trustees has  
18 determined to pay a fixed rate for mileage as  
19 reimbursement to officers and employees of the  
20 Village who use their personal automobiles while  
21 performing their official duties on behalf of the  
22 Village at a rate equal to the maximum as set  
23 forth by the Internal Revenue Service.

24 And, resolve that the following policies be  
25 readopted: procurement, sexual harassment, credit

1 card, capital assets, debt management,  
2 investment, board procedures, computer,  
3 automobile, cell phone and workplace violence.

4 And, resolve that the Board of Trustees  
5 authorize the payment in advance of audit of claim  
6 for public utility services, Medicare retirees;  
7 postage, freight & express charges pursuant to the  
8 Village Law 5-524 (6) and that such claims be  
9 presented at the next regular meeting for audit.

10 Lastly, be it resolved that the Board of  
11 Trustees designates the following institutions as  
12 depositories of all monies received by the Village  
13 as required by Village Law 4-412(3)(2): HSBC,  
14 NYCLASS, Gold Coast Bank, Flushing Commercial  
15 Bank, Valley National, TD Bank, Capital One,  
16 Empire, Bridgehampton, NB, Citibank, Sterling  
17 Bank.

18 Is there a Motion?

19 TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

20 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

21 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.  
22 After, the following ensued.)

23 MAYOR BEACH: Be it resolved, that the

21 TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

22 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

23 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.  
24 After, the following ensued.)

25 MAYOR BEACH: I think that completes

1 everything, right, John?

2 VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR GIORDANO: Yes.

3 MAYOR BEACH: Very good. On the agenda was  
4 the Fire Department Awards.

5 We were supposed to have awards to the Fire  
6 Department, but due to the Governor's continued  
7 regulations with COVID, we could not have the  
8 number of Members in this room.

9 So, we will table it and have another date  
10 set up.

11 Hopefully, we can have all the Members of  
12 the Department together and let them be recognized  
13 for the job they did on Shipherd Avenue, which was  
14 unbelievable and being a fireman for twenty-six  
15 years, I have to say those guys did a great job.

16 What I hear, everyone worked in unison and  
17 everything went like clockwork.

18 They need to be recognized for doing such a  
19 great job in keeping our Village safe.

20 (Whereupon, applause was heard. After, the  
21 following ensued.)

22 MAYOR BEACH: I have to give kudos to them.

23 I have said it in the past, you get up in  
24 the middle of the night to help somebody that is  
25 such a noble thing to do.



1           And, we have over two hundred and fifty  
2 Members that do that.

3           We thank them, again.

4           Okay, I will open up the Public Hearing for  
5 tax cap at 7:24 p.m., to consider the amendment of  
6 the Village Code of Chapter 222 taxation with  
7 respect to Article 8 of the authority for the tax  
8 limit override.

9           And, I will ask the Village Attorney.

10           TRUSTEE REARDON: The telephone number - -

11           MAYOR BEACH: Oh, yes, I am sorry, I have  
12 it on the paper, too.

13           Anybody that has any questions during the  
14 Public Hearing, they can call 516-599-2828 and Mr.  
15 Giordano will answer the phone and relay any  
16 questions you may have to us.

17           VILLAGE ATTORNEY ATKINSON: Mayor, Section  
18 3-C of the General Municipal Law sets off the  
19 framework where an Incorporated Village would be  
20 given the authority or grants itself the authority  
21 to override the tax cap, if it should so choose.

22           If you recall, this has been something that  
23 has been implemented each year since the tax cap  
24 has been enforced a number of years ago.

25           This by no means mandates that you have to

1       override the tax cap.

2               It just gives you the authority to do so.

3               So, you can go under or you can stay right  
4 at the tax cap or go over.

5               It is a vote of sixty percent of the  
6 Village Board that is required to, um, pass this,  
7 um, this law.

8               It has been duly noted in the Lynbrook  
9 Herald and really since we have had discussion on  
10 this issue in the past, there is really little  
11 case law going backwards, which always strikes me  
12 as "interesting."

13               And, I know Deputy Mayor Hawxhurst had a  
14 question about that last time.

15               MAYOR BEACH: Okay.

16               VILLAGE ATTORNEY ATKINSON: Simply gives  
17 you the authority to, it doesn't mandate you by  
18 any means.

19               MAYOR BEACH: Gives us the ability to do  
20 that if necessary.

21               VILLAGE ATTORNEY ATKINSON: Correct.

22               MAYOR BEACH: Thank you. No phone calls,  
23 John?

24               VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR GIORDANO: No.

25               MAYOR BEACH: Okay, I will ask for a

1 Motion to approve the possibility of going over  
2 the two percent tax cap.

3 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: So moved.

4 TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

5 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

6 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.  
7 After, the following ensued.)

8 MAYOR BEACH: Next on the agenda - - I  
9 will close that Public Hearing at 7:26 and open  
10 another Public Hearing.

11 No, we will table it.

12 I will ask to have it table Number 52 on  
13 the agenda for the Bicycle Chapter, Section 212-4.

14 A Motion to table.

15 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: I make a Motion to table.

16 TRUSTEE RYDER: Second.

17 MAYOR BEACH: All those in favor?

18 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard.  
19 After, the following ensued.)

20 VILLAGE ATTORNEY ATKINSON: Thank you,  
21 Mayor.

22 MAYOR BEACH: Next, I will have at 7:27,  
23 open a Public Hearing for the tentative budget and  
24 the same goes, any questions on the budget, call  
25 599-2828.

1 We are still working on the budget.

2 I don't have to tell you how difficult it  
3 has been for everyone this past two years, now, it  
4 seems like that is the way things are going but it  
5 has been a tough year and, now, we are going into  
6 another year and we are dealing with COVID.

7 We are expecting some Federal money that  
8 will help us but "show me the money" before I  
9 start talking.

10 It makes it a little difficult for us to  
11 figure out what the budget is going to exactly be.

12 But, we continue to work on it and we will  
13 table this until the 19<sup>th</sup>, if we are in agreement  
14 and I like to keep working on it.

15 We really - - the numbers keep changing as  
16 we keep working and we are trying to get it down  
17 as low as possible.

18 I don't have to tell you how difficult it  
19 is for the Village with this, at this point.

20 So, can I have a Motion to table this to  
21 the 19<sup>th</sup>.

22 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: So moved.

23 TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

24 MAYOR BEACH: There are no questions, John,  
25 no phone calls?

1 VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR GIORDANO: No.

2 MAYOR BEACH: I will - - there is no need  
3 to close it, we are leaving it open.

4 VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR GIORDANO: Close it.

5 MAYOR BEACH: Closed at 7:28, the Public  
6 Hearing.

7 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.  
8 After, the following ensued.)

9 MAYOR BEACH: Next is the training for the  
10 Police Chief in Queensbury, New York. The NYSACOP  
11 Conference. It is a local Chiefs conference.

12 I think this is great. It is a cost of  
13 three hundred and twenty-five dollars.

14 Any time a Police Chief can go to a  
15 conference and come back with some good  
16 information, I think it is well worthwhile.

17 I will make a Motion to accept.

18 I need a second.

19 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: So moved.

20 TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

21 MAYOR BEACH: All in those in favor?

22 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.  
23 After, the following ensued.)

24 MAYOR BEACH: Recreational Department,  
25 staffing Recreation Supervisor Keith Bonomo.

1           They would like to request a salary  
2 increase for part-timers, recreation attendants  
3 and to a minimum wage of fourteen dollars.

4           TRUSTEE REARDON: Don't they work there,  
5 now.

6           MAYOR BEACH: These names were mistakenly  
7 not included in the previous minimum wage.

8           They must be passed.

9           DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: I would like to  
10 table this.

11          MAYOR BEACH: Okay.

12          TRUSTEE REARDON: They are already working.  
13 They weren't on the previous list that we  
14 approved.

15          MAYOR BEACH: Why don't we table them for  
16 the 19<sup>th</sup> and they are asking for a wage increase.

17          Why don't we table it until the 19<sup>th</sup>. A  
18 Motion.

19          DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: So moved.

20          TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

21          MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

22          (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.  
23 After, the following ensued.)

24          MAYOR BEACH: We have the same thing with  
25 Mr. Bonomo who has some seasonal employee, new

1 Hires and requests the following recreation of  
2 ten seasonal, lifeguards, Grade 1 Seasonal  
3 Employees to be hired for the September, 2021  
4 season, lifeguard 1, seasonal, recreational  
5 attendant, lifeguard, Grade 1 Seasonal, Lifeguard,  
6 Grade 1, Seasonal and Attendant Seasonal, Rec.  
7 Attendant Seasonal.

8 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: So moved.

9 TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

10 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

11 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.  
12 After, the following ensued.)

13 TRUSTEE REARDON: I do recuse myself for

19 Allision Barber, Lifeguard - -

20 MAYOR BEACH: So moved.

21 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: So moved.

22 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

23 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.  
24 After, the following ensued.)
