1 MAYOR BEACH: Good Evening, everyone and
2 welcome to the February 16th Meeting.

3 This is also Grievance Night and we will
4 have one of our residents lead us in the Pledge of
5 Allegiance, Anthony.

6 (Whereupon, one of Lynbrook Residents led
7 the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. After,
8 the following ensued.)

9 MAYOR BEACH: Thank you. Good Evening,
10 everyone and welcome.

11 Anthony, this is Grievance Night and I,
12 guess we will start with you right away so we
13 don't have you hang out.

14 It would be great if you could go to the
15 podium, that would be nice.

16 So, you will state your name and address.

17 ANTHONY RICCIARDI: Anthony Ricciardi. 50
18 Cristabel Street.

19 MAYOR BEACH: Bring the mic closer to you,
20 if you can, thank you.

21 ANTHONY RICCIARDI: My name is Anthony
22 Ricciardi. 50 Christabel Street and, I guess I am
23 grieving the taxes on the house.

24 MAYOR BEACH: As I said before to you, you
25 have to give reasons why you think, why you

1 want to aggrieve your taxes and, do you have any
2 comps to share?

3 (Whereupon, "speak a little louder," was
4 heard called out from the audience. After, the
5 following ensued.)

6 ANTHONY RICCIARDI: The comps, so, I did
7 come up with a few comps for the house, as well.

8 I bought the house in January, um, for four
9 hundred and thirteen thousand and one dollar.

10 Um, so, you know, again, the house
11 currently is assessed at five hundred and three
12 thousand, I believe, um, so, even just that
13 difference, I think, you know, if anything shows
14 the value of the house is what it sold for most
15 recently.

16 Um, on top of that, I guess, I came and
17 found four comparables; one was on 2 Denton
18 Avenue.

19 It had a similar square footage of two
20 thousand and sixteen which sold for three hundred
21 and ninety thousand dollars on October 21st of
22 2020.

23 Um, the second comparable I found was 22
24 Devine Street which sold in April 23rd of 2018, um,
25 it is also a two-family.

1 It sold for four hundred thousand dollars.
2 Um, 38 Lincoln Place sold in August 27th of
3 2019, a larger house, also multi-family sold for
4 three hundred and twenty-one thousand and forty-
5 three dollars.

6 And, lastly, I have 25 Bayview Road, um,
7 which is also a two family sold in October 6th of
8 2020 for four hundred and twelve thousand five
9 hundred.

10 So, I think the four comps reflect that,
11 you know, the house's value is, you know, around
12 four hundred thousand dollars and the purchase
13 price of four hundred and thirteen thousand and
14 one dollar, also reflects the most current value
15 for the house.

16 MAYOR BEACH: Okay, thank you. So, you
17 will give those comps, if you give those to Lisa,
18 the Assessor.

19 ANTHONY RICCIARDI: I can give them to her.

20 MAYOR BEACH: What we do as I explained to
21 you before, we have an outside Counsel that we
22 give it to and he researched and he will contact
23 you and he lets you know his opinion.

24 Are there any questions from the Board?

25 (Whereupon, "No," was heard.)

1 After, the following ensued.)

2 MAYOR BEACH: Thank you. Nice to me you.

3 ANTHONY RICCIARDI: Pleasure.

4 MAYOR BEACH: Lisa, you said there is
5 another gentleman?

6 ASSESSOR KENNY: Yes, he was very adamant
7 about coming in.

8 MAYOR BEACH: So, we will start with our
9 Board agenda and if the gentleman comes in, we
10 will stop and take care of him.

11 That is Lisa, she is our Assessor.

12 Lisa, did you say "hello" to Paul? We will
13 go the agenda - - actually, there is an add-on
14 from the Titans Lacrosse seeking Village
15 assistance to raising a registration banner in the
16 Business District over Atlantic Avenue.

17 "We have been granted permission by the
18 Village over the past four years. We are asking
19 to do it, again."

20 I really don't know what we are doing, if
21 we are continuing the banner.

22 How does the Board feel about this?

23 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: I had a question
24 for John to check with our insurance consultant.

25 If you look at the insurance, it says

1 "coverage applies to only teams, leagues, one
2 hundred percent to Lacrosse players and coaches
3 during scheduled and supervised Lacrosse
4 activities."

5 So, I just want to make sure it covers us.

6 MAYOR BEACH: Okay.

7 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: So, I requested
8 that John speak to our insurance consultant, Jeff
9 Greenfield to make sure the insurance is
10 satisfactory.

11 MAYOR BEACH: If the insurance is
12 satisfactory and the weather is as it has been, it
13 is a consideration if the weather works with us,
14 is the Board willing to grant them permission to
15 hang the banner?

16 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: So moved.

17 TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

18 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

19 (Whereupon, a vote of Aye was heard by all.
20 After, the following ensued.)

21 MAYOR BEACH: It was just one add-on, John?

22 VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR GIORDANO: Yes. And,
23 the phone line is open.

24 MAYOR BEACH: I am sorry, John. If you
25 have any questions, you can dial in 516-599-2828

1 and if you have a question about anything, the
2 Village Administrator will take care of it and
3 relay the message.

4 First on the agenda is the Minutes of
5 January 25th, has the Board read the Minutes?

6 (Whereupon, "Yes" was heard from the
7 audience. After, the following ensued.)

8 MAYOR BEACH: Any changes?

9 (Whereupon, "No," was heard. After, the
10 following ensued.)

11 MAYOR BEACH: So, a Motion to approve the
12 Minutes of January 25th?

13 TRUSTEE BECKER: So moved.

14 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: Second.

15 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

16 (Whereupon, a vote of "Aye" was heard by
17 all. After, the following ensued.)

18 MAYOR BEACH: Thank you. We will now set
19 the Public Hearing for the CDBG Application on
20 March 22nd.

21 So, we need the Hearing date would be March
22 22nd, so, I need a Motion.

23 TRUSTEE BECKER: So moved.

24 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: Second.

25 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

1 (Whereupon, a vote of "Aye" was heard by
2 all. After, the following ensued.)

3 MAYOR BEACH: Next on the agenda is the bid
4 opening of the sidewalks.

5 You know what, I am sorry, I am going
6 because of the recess - - okay, the bid openings
7 for the sidewalks is not the next one.

8 So, the Board Meetings is next. "Notice is
9 hereby given that March 1st and March 15th, the
10 Meetings of the Board of Trustees have been
11 scheduled to Monday, March 22nd.

12 "Also, further Notice is given that the
13 April, 2021 regular Board Meetings of the Trustees
14 has been scheduled for April 5th and the 22nd."

15 I need a Motion.

16 TRUSTEE BECKER: So moved.

17 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: Second.

18 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

19 (Whereupon, a vote of "Aye" was heard by
20 all. After, the following ensued.)

21 MAYOR BEACH: Bid openings of the sidewalk.

22 There are bids received from four
23 construction companies.

24 Castle was the winning bid, if you agree.

25 Gorilla is one hundred and seven

1 thousand. Castle Industry was ninety-seven
2 thousand, five hundred - - ninety-seven thousand
3 nine hundred fifty.

4 Robustello & Sons was two hundred and
5 fifty-five thousand and five hundred and Stassi
6 General Contractors was one hundred and seventy
7 thousand.

8 I recommend staying with Castle. They have
9 been doing our sidewalks in the past and we have
10 had no issues at ninety-seven thousand nine
11 hundred and fifty.

12 I need a Motion.

13 TRUSTEE REARDON: So moved.

14 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Second.

15 MAYOR BEACH: All those in favor?

16 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.
17 After, the following ensued.)

18 MAYOR BEACH: We have an agreement on
19 Agenda Number 5.

20 Phil Healey has been talking with the
21 School District with an inter-municipality
22 agreement with the School District and the Village
23 for our mechanics to repair the School vehicles.

24 The rate would include mechanic wages plus
25 the 12.5 percent that is similar to the

1 percentages charges in the fuel and hourly rate
2 service for weekends, evenings and holidays,
3 storms, events or special requests at one hundred
4 and thirty dollars an hour.

5 They are our mechanics. They would bring
6 their cars, here and our mechanics would fix them.

7 Does anybody have any questions?

8 (Whereupon, "no" was heard by all. After,
9 the following ensued.)

10 MAYOR BEACH: May I have a Motion.

11 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: So moved.

12 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Second.

13 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

14 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.
15 After, the following ensued.)

16 MAYOR BEACH: Nice to have shared
17 services.

18 TRUSTEE REARDON: Yes.

19 MAYOR BEACH: Liotta Brothers Recycling, we
20 are seeking to get rid of our leaves and grass and
21 this is closer to the Village.

22 It is in Oceanside, closer than Kavanta.

23 Has everyone looked this over?

24 (Whereupon, "yes" was heard by all. After,
25 the following ensued.)

1 MAYOR BEACH: Are there any questions? I
2 need a Motion to approve.

3 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: So moved.

4 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Second.

5 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

6 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.

7 After, the following ensued.)

8 MAYOR BEACH: Is this the gentleman?

9 ASSESSOR KENNY: Yes.

10 MAYOR BEACH: So you don't have to sit
11 around, you can go right up there and we will give
12 you the opportunity to get up right, now and
13 present your case for grievance.

14 You are here for a grievance, right?

15 EHAB ZAKI: Yes.

16 MAYOR BEACH: State your name and address.

17 EHAB ZAKI: My name is Ehab Zaki. 216
18 Earle Avenue, Lynbrook.

19 MAYOR BEACH: Do you have any comps or
20 anything?

21 EHAB ZAKI: I submitted my form. I didn't
22 put any evidence on the form, but I feel like I
23 live on a different block in Lynbrook.

24 I live on a Commercial block, like across
25 from a gas station, right, door-to-door with

1 the hospital or dentist with the lawyer and even
2 my backyard I have two storages in my backyard
3 like a guy for a sound system, a guy for storage
4 restaurant system, a warehouse for restaurant
5 supplies, something like that.

6 So, I don't even have privacy in my
7 backyard.

8 They are above me.

9 They can see my backyard.

10 They can see my bedroom from the storage.

11 I don't think I am supposed to pay as much as
12 people do who live in the quiet and nice block
13 with nice view and all of those things.

14 That is the only reason, I have for my
15 house.

16 MAYOR BEACH: You didn't get any other
17 comps to compare your house in the neighborhood,
18 you know, other houses that are the same square
19 footage as yours within the area, within our
20 Village?

21 EHAB ZAKI: I didn't honestly look. It
22 might be, yes, it might be no but the location
23 might be different.

24 If you compare the square footage based on
25 the square footage, it doesn't make

1 a difference if my house if five thousand and the
2 other house is five thousand but the location is
3 different, not the house, itself.

4 MAYOR BEACH: I understand and that is
5 taken into consideration too when the Attorney
6 looks at it.

7 EHAB ZAKI: Yes, please.

8 MAYOR BEACH: What we do, here, is we take
9 your information and we give it to the outside
10 Attorney and he makes that evaluation.

11 He does the comparisons and he contacts
12 you.

13 EHAB ZAKI: Thank you, Mayor.

14 MAYOR BEACH: Nice to meet you.

15 EHAB ZAKI: Thank you.

16 MAYOR BEACH: Number 8 on the agenda is
17 authorizing Grant Guys to file the annual FEMA
18 A.F.G. FD that is the FEMA Grant for the Fire
19 Department.

20 I need a Motion.

21 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: So moved.

22 TRUSTEE REARDON: Second.

23 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

24 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.

25 After, the following ensued.)

1 MAYOR BEACH: 9 on the agenda, well, our
2 Attorney, I need a Motion to accept our Attorney
3 as our Tax Grievance Counsel.

4 TRUSTEE REARDON: So moved.

5 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: Second.

6 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

7 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.
8 After, the following ensued.)

9 MAYOR BEACH: Then we have bills.

10 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: Yes, Mr. Mayor, I move
11 that the bills listed in the abstract of audited
12 vouchers be paid as soon as they have been duly
13 audited by the Majority.

14 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Second.

15 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

16 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.
17 After, the following ensued.)

18 MAYOR BEACH: We have a few minutes more
19 that we need to occupy, do you have some
20 announcements?

21 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: Some quick announcements,
22 I wanted to remind everyone Lynbrook Little League
23 is still going onto March 1st, if you need
24 additional information, please, go to
25 www.lynbrooklittleleague.com for Lynbrook

1 Titans is going to be setting up registration
2 probably in March.

3 So those of use who are looking for getting
4 people signed up for football, please, take a look
5 for that.

6 MAYOR BEACH: That's it?

7 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: That's it.

8 MAYOR BEACH: We have another twelve
9 minutes.

10 TRUSTEE BOCCIO: I can read from the
11 phonebook if you like, Mr. Mayor.

12 MAYOR BEACH: Mr. Becker, do you have
13 anything?

14 TRUSTEE BECKER: Mayor, only to wish
15 everybody a Happy Fast and enjoy Lent and don't
16 forget to get your ashes tomorrow.

17 MAYOR BEACH: Deputy Mayor?

18 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: First off, I just
19 want to thank, we have had a couple of snowstorms
20 in the past couple of weeks and I just want to
21 thank our DPW, our OEM, our Fire Department, our
22 Police Department for all the hard work that they
23 have done, especially, our DPW, who is out there
24 plowing, you know, 24/7, you know, through this
25 storm.

1 The storm has lasted eighteen hours plowing
2 through it.

3 You know the number of praises we had for
4 our DPE workers was just tremendous.

5 They - - you know, I had to drive my
6 daughter, my daughter is a Nurse over at South
7 Nassau, so, with the first storm on the Monday, I
8 had to drive her to work and, you know, you drove
9 in Lynbrook, the roads were nice.

10 You drove out to the neighboring Village of
11 Rockville Centre, the roads weren't so nice.

12 It shows the quality of the work and the
13 quality of people that we have working in these
14 functions.

15 And, also to Robbie Gribbons and everybody
16 at OEM that staffed that office overnight to make
17 sure that communications was available that, you
18 know, if there was a need, you could get out.

19 So, I just wanted to thank them for all of
20 that.

21 Also, I wanted to thank Brian Lamsella,
22 Carrie Haber, Michael Haber and Lisa Lamsella for
23 all the work they have done over the past couple
24 of months, you know raising money through
25 different raffles for both our local businesses

1 and our Knights of Columbus.

2 The Knights of Columbus, like every other
3 business has suffered during the pandemic with,
4 you know, their business, basically shutdown,
5 couldn't rent a hall, so, they were losing all
6 their potential rental income.

7 They were closed for a year and looking at
8 the potential closing for another year or so,
9 there were really concerns if they were able to
10 continue as an organization there at that
11 location, um, you know, Brian Lansella running
12 numerous raffles, our small businesses stepped up
13 and, you know, along with his wife, Lisa, Carrie
14 Haber and her husband, Mike, the salami guy.

15 TRUSTEE REARDON: I can't believe he said
16 that.

17 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Stepped up and put
18 together a number of large raffles and raised over
19 forty-six thousand dollars to donate to the
20 Knights of Columbus.

21 So, you know, with rental halls being able
22 to open up after March 15th, we hope this can help
23 them through these tough times and it is a calling
24 for every business.

25 And, we see that in the Village and

1 you know, we have been lucky. We have a number
2 of new businesses that have opened up during this
3 pandemic and, you know, it is a testament to the
4 hard work these people have done and it is a
5 testament to what this Village has done to help
6 our businesses, you know, in any way they have
7 needed.

8 And, you know it is just great to see that
9 we are moving forward and hopefully with, you
10 know, the light at the end of the tunnel, we will
11 move passed this and you know, enjoy back to
12 normalcy at some point in the future - - near
13 future.

14 But, once, again, I just wanted to thank
15 them for all their hard work, Mr. Mayor.

16 MAYOR BEACH: Thank you. Thank you.

17 Ann Marie?

18 TRUSTEE REARDON: Actually, I am going to
19 echo what Deputy Mayor Hawxhurst said, um, it was
20 really amazing to see how many people worked
21 really hard during these snowstorms.

22 This was not fun.

23 Um, it is a lot of snow, um, it was quite
24 dreaded in my mind but they really did work around
25 the clock, worked very hard, you know, our

1 garbage still got picked up.

2 Everything got done in an orderly fashion
3 from the Police being able to, um, you know,
4 assist people in the community, the Fire
5 Department being on-call.

6 I mean I know I heard one story that some
7 of the volunteers were staying at their station
8 for forty-eight hours with a mattress on the floor
9 just in case something happened.

10 You know we have these amazing people
11 within our community that really step up when it
12 is a time of potential need or have need.

13 You know, they didn't know what was going
14 to happen and that storm was tough and the idea
15 that we might be getting another is actually
16 dreadful.

17 And, I think Summer needs to come, Mayor.

18 MAYOR BEACH: No time soon as it sounds.

19 TRUSTEE REARDON: Summer, that is what we
20 need.

21 MAYOR BEACH: I do have some comments.

22 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: One other quick
23 thing I want to throw out there, again, with the
24 snow, you know, we have an organization, Lynbrook
25 CARES Committee that has helped numerous

1 Residents, numerous Senior residents, numerous
2 residents in need, shovel their homes, whether it
3 is students or other people that help to volunteer
4 the scouts, students, adults.

5 There are two gentlemen that kind of ran
6 with that and kind of taken over the reigns of it,
7 Jim Kirby and Ken Mundy, they have done a
8 tremendous job putting snowblowers in the back of
9 their truck driving around helping people out,
10 spending all day out there, shoveling out for
11 residents.

12 I want to thank them, also.

13 TRUSTEE REARDON: Yes.

14 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Again, a testament
15 to our community of people like that, you know,
16 who stepped up and volunteered, you know, to help
17 out the residents.

18 Thank you.

19 MAYOR BEACH: The name is very fitting,
20 Lynbrook CARES, those guys do a great job.

21 I have to comment on the DPW because they
22 did an excellent job and some of our neighbors
23 were upset because, "I shovel my walk and others,"
24 and when you finish doing your driveway and the
25 truck comes back down the street and plows

1 you back in, again, you know and you are doing it
2 again.

3 I can see people getting a little
4 aggravated, that is the only way we can do it.

5 If you notice this past storm, they didn't
6 go to the actual curb because there was so much
7 snow.

8 They got two lanes opened in the middle of
9 the street which lets cars go by but if they went
10 all the way to the curb, they would have just
11 pushed all that extra snow back on the sidewalks
12 and, then, you really would have been going crazy
13 moving that out of the way.

14 And, since the volume of the snow, as it
15 was, we would have people in our Village with
16 hurting backs, so, I ask you God forbid if we get
17 a snowstorm like that, be a little patient with
18 these guys.

19 There were some phone calls made to Village
20 Hall and there were, um, angst to the Sanitation
21 guys as they drove by, you know, clogging up those
22 driveways, again, we just - - these guys are up
23 for long hours.

24 Be patient with them and you know, they are
25 doing a great job as Mike said before,

1 our streets were much better than anybody else.

2 You know, we have the Citizen Taxpayer that
3 lives in Rockville Centre and he is constantly
4 comparing Lynbrook to Rockville Centre because of
5 his businesses in Lynbrook and I am going to say,
6 Jeffery told me that Lynbrook was much better than
7 Rockville Centre, much better.

8 So, that being said, Mayor Murray, there is
9 nothing better than Lynbrook when it comes to
10 removing snow.

11 We have the best DPW on Long Island and
12 those guys attest to it, they did a great job.

13 Phil Healey did a tremendous job having the
14 guys do it.

15 Mike said before that he went into another
16 area and it was horrible and it was much better,
17 here.

18 You can actually see the difference.

19 I will even say from State roads, County
20 roads, Lynbrook was much better.

21 If anything, give them "Atta boy," when you
22 see them.

23 Another thing was made, the garbage did not
24 miss. They came and did it.

25 The storm was on and everybody's garbage

1 was picked up on Wednesday and the Village was in
2 great shape, once, again, and the cops, the
3 firemen, I can't say enough about the firemen.

4 They go on their own time.

5 They go not the firehouses and they stay
6 there.

7 God forbid if there is an emergency, they
8 can respond right from the firehouse instead of
9 them coming from their homes.

10 That is very dedicated.

11 There are a lot of dedicated people in our
12 Village.

13 I can't thank them enough.

14 The other thing I have to say there is the
15 Village Election on March 16th at Greis Park from
16 7:00 in the morning until 9:00 p.m.

17 The polies will be open, um, and you can
18 vote by mail.

19 If you need to have a ballot sent to you,
20 you can call Village Hall, 599-8300 or on the
21 website for the application.

22 I am just trying to think if there is
23 anything else and I don't think there is.

24 We have another five minutes. I thought
25 John would get up and sing for five minutes.

1 TRUSTEE REARDON: I actually thought the
2 Mayor was going to sing.

3 MAYOR BEACH: That isn't going to happen.

4 With that being said, there is another
5 storm on Thursday. I am glad you said that John,
6 if you can, please, keep your cars off the road,
7 it makes it so much easier for those guys.

8 And, I know I will go back to the
9 driveways, I know they get blocked in.

10 Please, do not put your car blocking your
11 driveway because, now, the plow goes around your
12 car, we are back to square one with the snow in
13 the middle and when you shovel your driveway out,
14 try to put the snow off to the sides.

15 If you need to park - - someone gave me a
16 suggestion because some people sometimes have to
17 park in the street, if we can possibly and there
18 was an idea that was to do odd and even days.

19 If the snow get that high on the odd days,
20 park on the odd side of the street.

21 On the even days, park on the even side of
22 the street so it leave3 room for our emergency
23 apparatus to get down the street, so, they are not
24 doing a serpentine through the block and sometimes
25 the cars are very close and the apparatuses can't

1 get through and to back out a fire truck on a
2 block is very difficult.

3 So, try to use a little common sense there
4 and leave room for apparatuses and the emergency
5 ambulances and things like that.

6 It would be much appreciated by the Fire
7 Department and Police Department and I think I am
8 really done, now.

9 Tallyhoe has finally gotten their
10 firetruck. It is going to be in their quarters
11 tomorrow, their brand new firetruck.

12 Now, this past year, what we have done, we
13 purchased two firetrucks, one firetruck wasn't up
14 on it but we saved so much money for the Village
15 buying two at once, it just made sense to go ahead
16 and do it.

17 Tallyhoe will get theirs tomorrow. It will
18 not be in service right away. There is a few
19 things that have to be done but it will be in
20 their garage.

21 And, then, the other is Engine Company, I
22 think they come in late April, John?

23 CLERK ADMINISTRATOR GIORDANO: Late April.

24 MAYOR BEACH: They get their apparatus, we
25 are getting quality equipment for our

1 Village.

2 We are maintaining the best fire protection
3 on Long Island and I am very proud these guys are
4 working with us to allow us because we usually,
5 there is a routine that they go through and they
6 research each fire truck that they want when the
7 Village came to them and said we like to move this
8 way to save the taxpayers some money, especially
9 in this time with the COVID or the Wuhan Virus or
10 whatever you want to call it, now that we are so
11 confused with what is going on in the World, this
12 was nice that they worked with the Village and we
13 appreciate that.

14 Now, I do not have anything else. We did
15 not trade the apparatuses, usually I can't go
16 there, right, we are much better off selling the
17 vehicles privately.

18 And, we did get more money doing that for
19 the apparatuses and, you know, a little extra
20 savings for the Village.

21 TRUSTEE BECKER: Mr. Mayor, if I could
22 mention two things, a couple of Lynbrook
23 residents, longtime Lynbrook residents, everything
24 with the pandemic and everything that has been
25 going on, there has sadly been a lot of loss

1 of life and people passing away but two people, in
2 particular, John Beyrer was a long-term teacher at
3 Lynbrook - -

4 MAYOR BEACH: When did he pass?

5 TRUSTEE BECKER: A couple of days ago.

6 MAYOR BEACH: I didn't hear that.

7 TRUSTEE BECKER: A long-term teach at
8 Lynbrook High School and good, dear friend.

9 MAYOR BEACH: Played the pipes.

10 TRUSTEE BECKER: Yes, yes, played the
11 pipes.

12 MAYOR BEACH: Sorry to hear that.

13 TRUSTEE BECKER: And, Patricia Fitzgerald,
14 a long-term Lynbrook Resident, she was a big
15 volunteer at Momma's House, Inc. and she passed
16 away recently.

17 If we could, possibly have a moment of
18 silence and all of those that passed away
19 recently.

20 MAYOR BEACH: Okay.

21 (Whereupon, a moment of silence was
22 observed by the Assembly. After, the following
23 ensued.)

24 TRUSTEE BECKER: Thank you, Mr. Mayor.

25 MAYOR BEACH: You're welcome.

1 Hurray, before time is up.

2 ASSESSOR KENNY: I read Facebook, here and
3 there are some Lynbrook residents who have said
4 today that they love our walking trail but many
5 people are walking their dogs and not picking up
6 after them, especially with the snow, it doesn't
7 magically disappear.

8 It is not just the walking trail, it is all
9 over Town, so, if people can be mindful of that,
10 please, pickup after your dog while walking them
11 through Town.

12 MAYOR BEACH: It is a very sensitive
13 topic.. I do get a lot of complaints about dogs
14 not being walked in the street.

15 Just be considerate of others with your dog
16 and of our neighbors and please pick up. Thank
17 you.

18 ASSESSOR KENNY: We love our dogs.

19 MAYOR BEACH: With that, I will make a
20 Motion to close the Meeting.

21 TRUSTEE BECKER: So moved.

22 DEPUTY MAYOR HAWXHURST: Second.

23 MAYOR BEACH: All in favor?

24 (Whereupon, a vote of aye was heard by all.
25 After, the following ensued.)

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MAYOR BEACH: Thank you. Enjoy the week.

(Whereupon, the official meeting of the
Lynbrook Board of Trustees was concluded. Time
noted: 9:00 p.m.)
